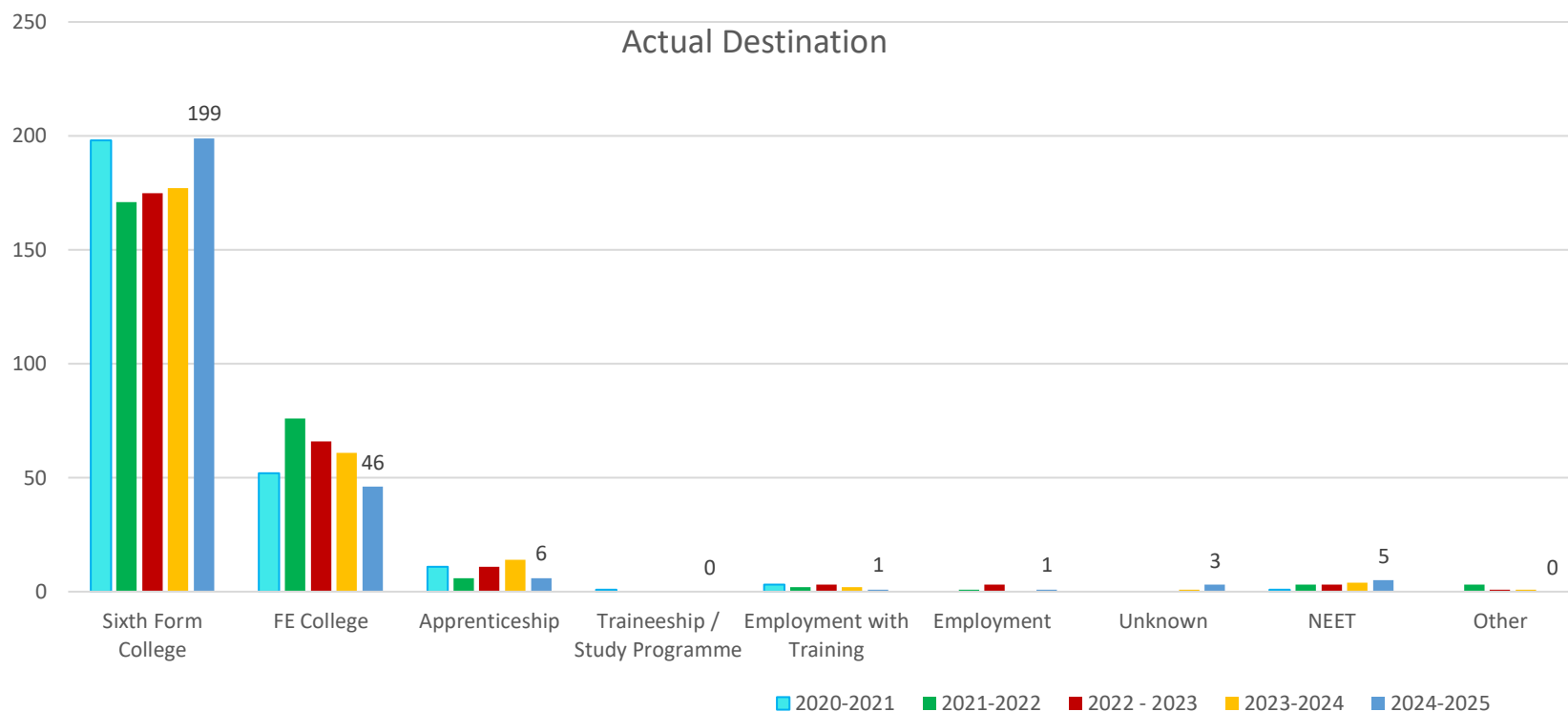


Y11 Destinations 2020 – 2025



2024 – 2025 – Total Students = 261

2021 – 2022 – Total Students = 262

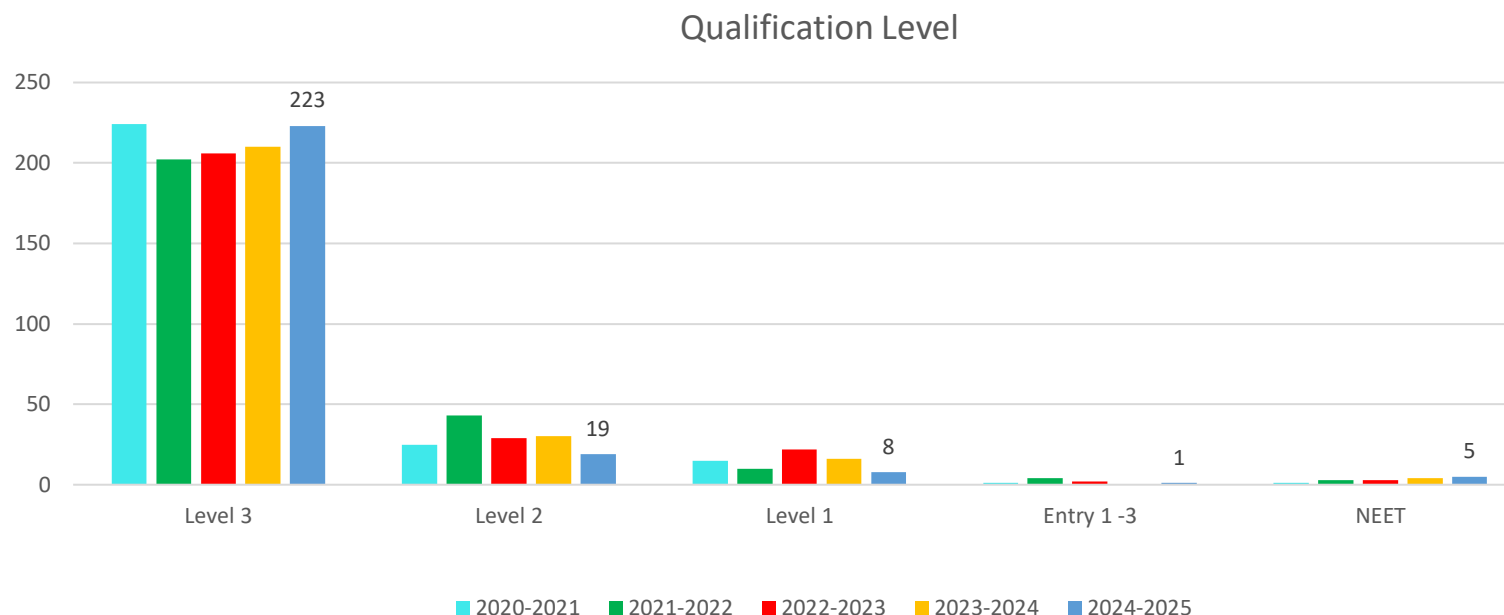
65% (171 students) progressed onto a Sixth Form College

The latest data shows that our school's NEET (Not in Education, Employment, or Training) rate stands at **1.9%**, which is significantly lower than the **national average of 12.8%**. This indicates that our students are transitioning into further education, employment, or training at a much higher rate than their peers nationally. Such a low NEET figure reflects positively on the school's commitment to student support, career guidance, and post-16 progression planning. It is a strong indicator of the effectiveness of our educational provision and the resilience of our learners.

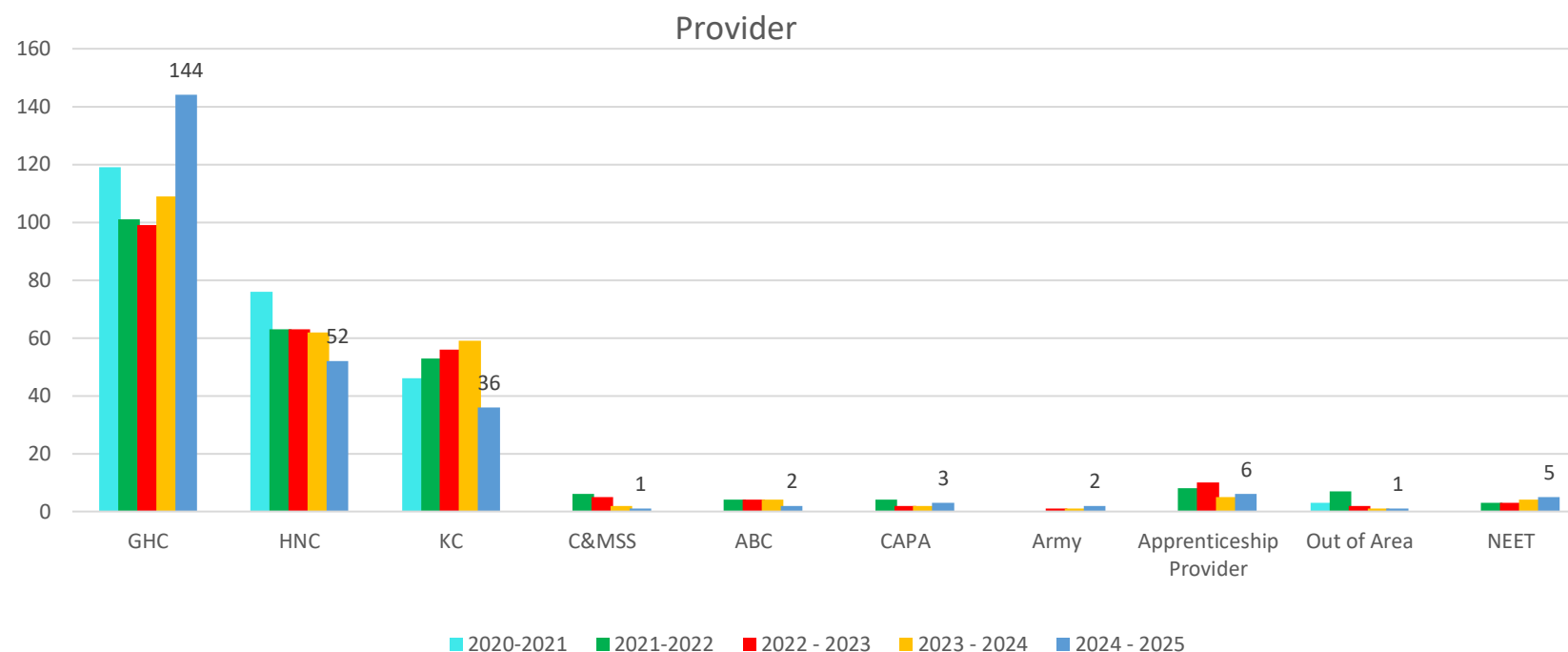

Over the past five years, the majority of students have continued onto **Level 3 qualifications**, showing a consistent upward trend in higher-level progression.

- **Level 3 destinations** increased from **77% in 2021–2022** to **85% in 2024–2025**, demonstrating strong post-16 academic and vocational outcomes.
- **Level 2 pathways** have seen a gradual decline from **16% in 2021–2022** to **7% in 2024–2025**, reflecting a shift towards higher-level study.
- **Level 1 and Entry Level destinations** remain low, with **3% of students** progressing to Level 1 in 2024–2025.
- The **NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training)** rate has consistently remained minimal throughout the period, suggesting effective transition support and careers guidance.

Overall, these figures highlight positive progression trends, with the vast majority of students successfully advancing to sustained education or training at Level 3.

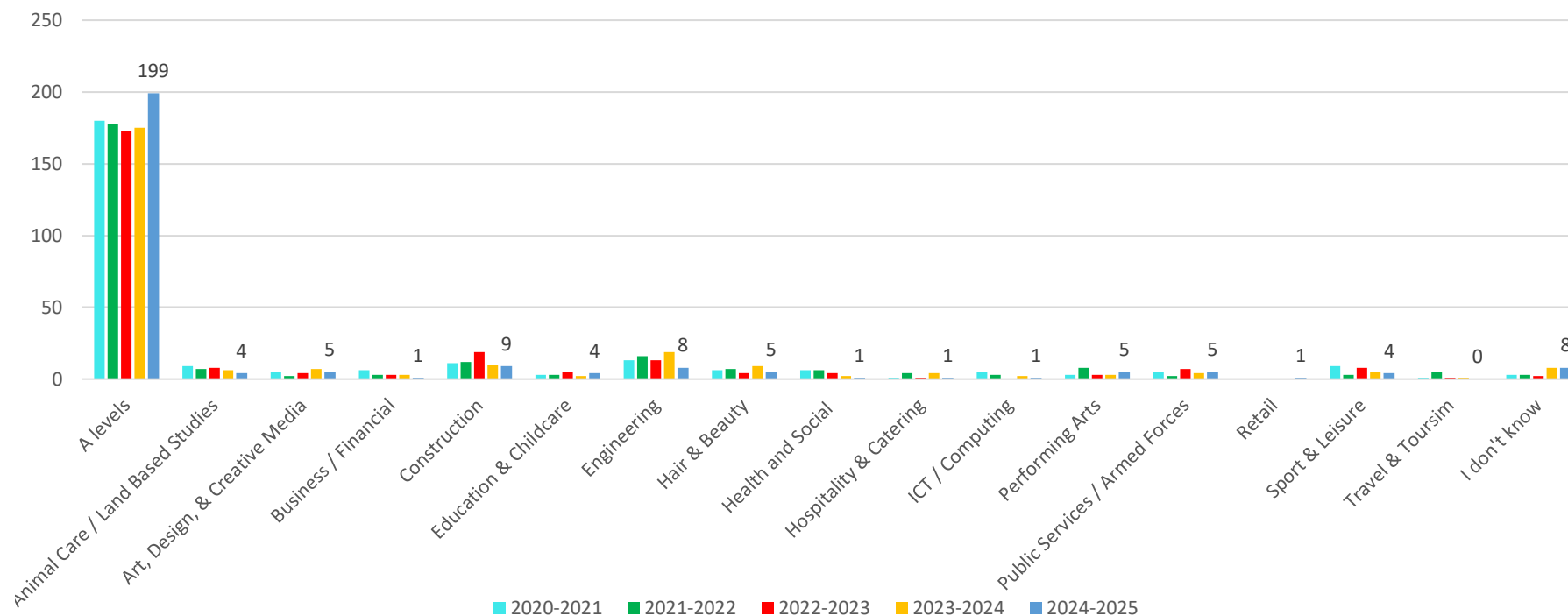

Industries / Sectors of Interest



A levels have remained the most popular area of interest since 2020. Between 2020 and 2024, there was a gradual decline of around 1–2 students each year enrolling on A level courses. However, 2025 saw the highest number of students progressing to A levels since records began.

Construction and Engineering continue to be the most popular sectors of interest, reflecting strong local labour market opportunities in engineering, manufacturing, and construction-related occupations.

Animal Care and Land-based studies, Art, Design and Creative Media, Hair and Beauty, and Sport and Leisure also remain consistently popular areas among students.

There has been a noticeable increase in students selecting “**I don’t know**” as their intended destination. This group mainly includes those enrolled on **Explorer programmes** or **multi-skills courses** at college, as well as students currently **NEET** (Not in Education, Employment or Training).
